Background: Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act

Signed into law on July 22, 2014

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- Vision The workforce system will be characterized by three critical hallmarks of excellence:
 - The needs of business and workers drive workforce solutions;
 - One-Stop Centers (or American Job Centers) provide excellent customer service to jobseekers and employers and focus on continuous improvement; and
 - The workforce system supports strong regional economies and plays an active role in community and workforce development.
- Across the system, continuous improvement is supported through evaluation, accountability, identification of best practices, and data driven decision making.

WIOA Vision for Data Integration

- New primary indicators of performance across all four titles of WIOA
- Integrated data element layout for WIOA core programs and other ETA programs
 - Uniformity in data collection and definitions among all workforce programs will allow for benefits to grantees in terms of programming multiple data collection systems
 - Long term goal:
 - Integration of ETA program data files into one submission, to facilitate the submission of one data file which will include participant records for all ETA programs associated with an individual.
 - This would also enable the calculation of unique counts of participants ETA-wide, as well as evaluate the effectiveness of different mixes of services received.
- In practice, the vision also includes case management and service delivery

ETA Internal Data Integration

- Participant Individual Record Layout (PIRL)
- ❖ Workforce Integrated Performance System (WIPS)
 - System launched on October 1, replacing the WIA performance reporting system
 - Allows states/grantees to submit an individual record file
 - Automatically generates uniform quarterly/annual reports
 - Common edit checks and validation rules to ensure accurate and consistent data
